2016 Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the Dog Writers Association of America was held February 14, 2016 in the Gold Ballroom, Hotel Pennsylvania, NYC.

Present: Elaine Gewirtz, Marsha Pugh, Susan Ewing, Peri Norman, Ann Hohenhaus, Ranny Green, Carmen Battaglia, Linda Johnston, Lauren Darr, Jody Miller-Young, Jen Reeder, Bryna Comsky, Lea-Ann Germinder. Guests: Skye Anderson, Garry McDaniel.

The meeting was called to order by vice president, Elaine Gewirtz at 8:02 and the minutes of last year's meeting approved as published in ruff DRAFTS, Spring, 2015.

The president's report was submitted in writing and will be published in the newsletter.

Secretary Susan Ewing reported that 16 new members had joined DWAA in 2016 and there were six more applications pending.

Treasurer Marsha Pugh reported that as of December 31, 2015, we had a balance of \$23,591.21 with \$1001.01 in our restitution account.

Contest chair Elaine Gewirtz noted an increase in entries. Peri Norman moved that we increase fees for the contest, leaving the exact amount to the discretion of the contest chair. Ann Hohenhaus seconded. Passed unanimously.

Marsha Pugh reported on the banquet, noting that although the base meal cost \$69, with the addition of various taxes and with tip, the price went over \$100 per person. Having a mini-conference this year helped defray some of the costs, but the fear is that eventually, we will be priced out of the New York market.

Ann Hohenhaus, who lives in the city, is a part of another group that is using the NYC Conference and Seminar Center in April and she will check out this venue for us. If it would work, it would cut our costs from approximately \$12,000 to \$6,000.

There was a discussion on getting more sponsorship and Peri Norman has offered to help with that.

Both Joel Gavriele-Gold and Martin Deeley agreed to serve on the board for another term. President Ida Estep appointed member Karen Harbert to fill the unexpired term of Robert McKowen.

Lea-Ann Germinder presented a public relations report. She has been publicizing our organization and event, through her company, Good News for Pets.

She interviewed seminar speakers and VP Elaine Gewirtz. There were press releases on Twitter, Snapchat and Goodnewsforpets.com.

Her firm also uses <u>prweb.com</u> which goes out to national media, as well as Sisson which also gets the word out.

She recommends a p.r. committee to work with her in the coming year.

Peri Norman moved to adjourn and the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 a.m.




