Click and Play Agility: Clicker Training for Successful Dog

Agility by Angelica Steinker, Courteous Canine, Inc. Publishing,

Click and Play Agility starts off with some excellent theory and explanations of clicker training. The information is clear and concise so you don't feel lost in a lot of psychobabble or esoteric behavior modification. Angelica herself has had Jack Russell Terriers and now has a Min Pin along with a couple of Border Collies so she also has dealt with small dog, big attitude problems.

Once Angelica has YOU trained in the art of using a clicker, she then applies the technique to teaching your dog agility skills from jumping to contacts. Really fun is her section on TAG teaching – Teaching With Acoustical Guidance. This TAG technique is actually for you and is used to refine your handling. This time you get the positive sound when the body part you are working on performs correctly. So if you are working on keeping your arm out for



a certain turn, you get a TAG if you do it correctly. This technique makes you much more aware of what your body is doing as you run a course.

Handling and body awareness are not covered in many agility books, so this info is invaluable. As Angelica puts it, "The key to good handling is body awareness. ...It is impossible to be aware of what your body is doing if you are trying to remember where the next obstacle is or thinking about how you are going to get your dog turned toward the next set of obstacles." No wonder I am a lousy agility handler!

tend to have too many chemicals. She even covers skin care for hairless dogs. Absolutely adorable photos and graphics fill this colorful book. Wood, who lives with Papillons, knows what she's talking about (compared to those of us who have regular clipper incidents). This book makes a terrific gift for a new-time toy breed owner or a seasoned one. Get one for yourself while you're at it!

We are well into the 2007 Writing Competition, even though entries don't close until Oct. 2nd. Judging by what I've already received, this year's contest is going to be brimming with quality. The last time I chaired the contest, we did not have e-mail. Questions were all handled via the telephone, which became expensive and very time-consuming. Wow. For special awards, we need 1 extra copy plus an extra entry form for each special award.

I'm in the process of putting together 15 or 20 teams of 3 judges each. Please, if you are asked to judge, make time in your schedule for this very important honor. Packages will be going out to the judges from mid- to the end of October, and I'll need your decisions by mid-November.

We opened up one more regular category for books. This is non-fiction, which will be category #39.

Award: \$500.00 + **up to** \$350.00 travel stipend if winner attends the awards banquet on 2/10/08.

### L. North Shore Animal League America Award

Eligible: All media

Criteria: Best supports the missions of the League's program, encouraging spay/neuter initiatives as a way of reducing unwanted births and pet euthanasia rates; focus can be on community-wide programs or individual responsibility of pet owners.

Award: \$500.00
