Freelance journalist Jen Reeder is a strong believer in the importance of work that helps and celebrates dogs, which is reflected in her service to DWAA and her writing itself.

In 2017, Jen began serving a 2-year term as DWAA President after learning the organization faced financial issues and waning interest. She spearheaded programs to add value to membership, such as Editor Insights, Successful Queries and Young Writers on the Web, which seeks to nurture the next generation of dog writers.

Jen revived the DWAA blog, scouted locations for the awards banquet - which she organized both years - and attracted new sponsors for special awards, including an increase of \$7,900 in the first year alone. She has continued to serve on the Executive Committee for the past two years as Immediate Past President.

On the writing front, Jen works to educate and inspire dog lovers with service articles as well as profiles of dogs and advocates who make the world a better place. She's been busy covering breaking news about coronavirus and pets for the TODAY show's website and has written over 80 articles about pets mainly dogs – for national publications since the onset of the pandemic.

Her byline has appeared in AKC Family Dog, BBC News, The Daily Beast, HuffPost, Family Circle, Woman's World, The Christian





2021 WRITING COMPETITION **UPDATES**

The 2021 DWAA Writing Competition will accept entries beginning July 5, 2021. All online entries must be submitted on or before Sunday, September 5, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. EST. Mail-in entries must be postmarked no later than Saturday, September 4, 2021, as evidenced by the postmark. In either case, submissions must be accompanied by payment in full.

A panel of three judges scores each entry. Judges consist of DWAA members and non-members who are professional writers and editors. Judges' scores determine the nominees and winners. Judges may enter the competition, but will not judge entries in categories they enter.

Judges' decisions are final. A list of judges will be posted in October, 2021.

Nominees will be announced via DWAA's website and social media properties (i.e. Twitter, Instagram, and Facebook) on Monday, December 6, 2021. Winners will be announced TBD.

Nominees in the regular and special categories receive certificates. Winners of regular categories receive the DWAA Maxwell Medallion, named in honor of the late Maxwell Riddle. Winners of special categories receive awards as listed on the DWAA's website.

Eligibility

- The competition is open to all writers, editors, publishers, photographers, artists and others whose work falls into the designated competition categories.
- Members and non-members may apply.
- Competition is open to all eligible writers worldwide.
- Discounted member entry fees are available to members in good standing as of May 1, 2021.
- Only original work published between September 1, 2020 and August 31, 2021 will be accepted.
- Reprints, revisions, updates of previously published work are not eligible.
- An entry may be submitted in only one regular category. Exception: A book containing art may be submitted in a book category and in one or more art categories and requires two or more entry fees.
- Magazines, newsletters and blogs must be published at least quarterly.
- Submissions begin July 5, 2021 at 6:00 a.m. EST. The competition closes for online entries on September 5, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. EST.
- All mail-in entries must be postmarked no later than Saturday, September 4, 2021. NO EXCEPTIONS.




